Be a Good Neighbour

All owners are reminded that if you have hardwood flooring in your unit, to please place padding under furniture that may be moved regularly (chairs etc.) in order to prevent disturbing neighbours below you.

Cielo Library

Basic Earthquake Procedures

The strata council would like to pass along the following information to residents, so they are prepared for a possible earthquake:

As soon as the building begins to move, try to get into the inner hallway of the building, ideally the stairwell. The idea is to get out of and away from the building as glass could "pop" all over the place. The building is designed to stay together although parts of it, for example the windows, may be unstable.

It is very important NOT to go under a bed or a table. If you have to lie down when the building starts to move, get close to a wall and the closer that wall is to the centre stairwell, the safer you will be.

During an earthquake, the utilities (power, water, gas, sewer, etc.) will be lost. It will take approximately 72 hours for emergency services to have these utilities up and running; however, it could take longer. Ensure you have a minimum 72-hour supply of water, food and specific items you need to survive. Also, batteries, a radio, a small stove, a butane heater and a first aid kit are basic supplies you will need to survive until emergency services can reach you. Usually, within the 72-hour period, areas are established which are designated for people to move into and be taken care of.
